Dear 4-H Friends & Family:

It is hard to believe that it is the start of the new 4-H year. There are some upcoming programs and paperwork needed to conclude last year and begin preparing for the new 4-H year.

- The 4-H online registration for the new year will begin on September 6.
 Your club enrollment coordinator has the information needed to begin the
 enrollment process. New this year: 4-H is now open to all youth in 5K-13
 grade. K-2 will be in the Cloverbuds program with 3rd graders having the
 option to of taking the Exploring project or regular projects.
- Each club is encouraged to consider putting together a window display to promote their club to the community. This year's theme for the window display is "#iam4H". Registration can be found in this newsletter.
- County record book evaluation is September 8th beginning at 5:00 p.m. Any club that sends record books to the county level must have at least one adult present to help critique record books. Award pick up is also September 8th from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Officer training will be held on Monday, September 26th beginning at 6:30 p.m. at the courthouse. There is training for President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Historian and Reporter. Also that evening, the Historian Book Judging will take place. If your club is entering a Historian Book to be judged, at least one adult and one youth need to be present to help critique the books. Following judging and officer training there will be pizza served.
- The **Conservation Speaking Contest** will be held on Monday, October 17th at St. Peter's Catholic School beginning at 6:00 p.m. Youth are encouraged to participate in this program. Registration can be found in this newsletter.

Wisconsin 4-H Key Award

The Key Award is the most prestigious award that a 4-H member can receive. This award is based on a member's total 4-H record, projects, leadership, and activity involvement.

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated a consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied leadership skills, and actively participated in the function of their 4-H club and community.

To be eligible, candidates must be in 9th grade or above and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

Each Key Award recipient receive a framed certificate and Key Award pin.

Muzzle Loading

The Chippewa County Shooting Sports Program is again offering a Muzzle loading Course open to any 4-H member and parents. Participants must be at least 12 years old.

Participants will learn how to load, shoot, and care for muzzleloaders. We will use the WI 4
-H muzzle loading Project Course and National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association Basic
Muzzle Loading Course using both caplock and flintlock rifles to teach safety and shooting
fundamentals, when switch to muzzle loading shotguns, Kentucky style muzzle loading pistols, cap and ball
revolver, and Civil War era Springfield rifled musket. WE will include some history, and some learning of bygone skills. For those interested in hunting, we can help you develop hunting loads. The day will end with an
opportunity to qualify to go to the National 4-H Championships in 2017. In addition, a gun cleaning class will
immediately follow the muzzle loading course.

The course will be held at the Bloomer Rod & Gun Club on **Saturday**, **September 17 beginning promptly at 9:00 a.m.** Parents are encouraged to take the course with their child. We need at least 6 participants to hold the class.

2016-2017 4-H Enrollment

Re-enrollment and new enrollment will again be done through 4-H Online at www.4-honline.com. Enrollment for the 2016-2017 4-H year will begin on September 6th. At that time, all active members will be set to "inactive" in 4-H Online. When you log in to re-enroll, be sure to confirm your contact information is correct. This information is used regularly to contact and notify members of upcoming happenings and news. You will also need to review and confirm the expectation and behavior agreements. You'll also need to update your health information. Health information is required for all youth attending any type of overnight event, we ask that all members complete this information during enrollment to ensure delays are not encountered later in the year for events.

Clubs and projects will remain in your profile. You'll just need to add any new projects and delete the projects you no longer want. Once you have completely updated your profile, you'll click submit.

It is imperative that members enroll or re-enroll on time by November 1, 2016. These deadlines are set the State Office for grant reporting information. Please make sure to give yourself enough time to get this taken care of so we can have a wonderful New 4-H Year!

Youth Enrollment Deadlines to keep in mind:

November 1, 2016 - deadline for 4-H reenrollments. Youth who have been absent/inactive for more than 12 months are considered a new member upon joining 4-H again.

March 1, 2017 - deadline for 4-H members to sign up for all 4-H projects if they plan on exhibiting at the county fair.

Member enrollment begins September 6, 2016!!! A friendly reminder to those entering the 12th or 13th grade, are 18 years of age and enrolling into 4-H during the 2016-2017 year, be sure to enroll as a "youth" not an "adult". This will ensure you are included in all youth member related activities, reports and correspondence. Contact the Extension Office if you need further explanation.

Welcoming New Members and Families

Fall is a time of transitions for many 4-H Clubs. Some members graduate and some families may choose to try a new club or new experience. Other families have just learned about 4-H and have chosen your club for their 4-H involvement. Ensuring that these new families and members are welcomed into our clubs is everyone's responsibility.

Most of us probably remember being new to a group. We probably felt excited to experience new things and meet new people. Often, we felt nervous and worried because we didn't completely understand what was going on. Sometimes, we feel this way for quite a while. We're going to focus on how we can welcome new members and their families by getting better acquainted and sharing information on how 4-H works. Here is an activity to try to welcome new members—

Activity: Across the Line

(Direct club members to stand on one side of the line. If there is enough space, include parents and volunteers. As an option you could have participants stand up and sit down instead of crossing a line.) This is a get -to-know-you-better game. (Add or change questions to better fit the club). When I make a statement that applies to you, step over the line. Look around to see who has stepped across the line and who hasn't. After we're done with the statement, you will step back across the line before the next one. Step across the line...

- 1. If you like summer
- 2. If you're wearing red
- 3. If you ate breakfast this morning
- 4. If you've been in the 4-H club for 3 or more years
- 5. If you like winter
- 6. If you have blue eyes
- 7. If you've been to 4-H camp
- 8. If you like mushrooms on pizza
- 9. If you're in the 4-H Food project (or substitute a popular club project)
- 10. If you have a brother
- 11. If you are a dog person
- 12. If you play a sport
- 13. If you've given a talk in 4-H
- 14. If you've ever been to Washington, D.C.
- 15. If you've taken a project to the county fair
- 16. If you're in the 4-H Photography project (or another popular club project)

Did anyone learn something new about someone? How about something new about someone that you've known for a while?

All of us were new to 4-H at one time. We know that it seems like a lot to learn and it can be a bit overwhelming. Our goal is to have fun while learning new skills. It is not our goal to frustrate new members. So, experience 4-H one season at a time. Ask questions. We're glad to have new members and families in our group! You make our club more fun and interesting!

Instructions-Financial Reimbursement Request Form

The Chippewa County 4-H Leaders Council includes money in their budget to help defray some costs of 4-H trips/activities in which Chippewa County 4-H members participate. The amount the Council is able to contribute in a given year depends on the success of fund raising efforts, the amounts spent in other budget areas, and the number of applicants. For the fiscal year, the maximum reimbursement amount given per member is \$200.00.

A "Financial Reimbursement Request Form" has been developed for use when an individual or group is requesting monetary support for an out of county educational experience. Use of the form will provide a consistent, concise approach for obtaining information.

The 4-H Leaders' Executive Board will evaluate the request and the applicant is asked to follow the guidelines listed below. The form must be completed and submitted to the Extension office no later than September 26, 2016.

Please answer all questions completely so your request receives full attention. Dear 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS ENTHUSIAST:

4-H Youth in Wisconsin are being offered a chance to learn traditional muzzle loading shooting and to partake in good-natured fun, as was done at trappers' rendezvous over a century ago. Chippewa County has pioneered 4-H muzzle loading in Wisconsin, and you can be part of it! The course will be a one day workshop on Saturday, September 17. We will use the WI 4-H Muzzle loading Project Course and National Muzzle Loading Rifle Association (NMLRA) Basic Muzzle Loading Course using both caplock and flintlock rifles to teach safety and shooting fundamentals, then switch to muzzle loading shotguns, Kentucky style muzzle loading pistols, cap and ball revolver, and Civil War era Springfield rifled musket. We will include some history, and some learning of by-gone skills. For those interested in hunting, we can help you develop hunting loads.



TITLE IX INFORMATION

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972

The specific purposes of Title IX are to prohibit discrimination against individuals in federally-funded programs or activities, and in every aspect of employment because of their gender. Title IX provisions include prohibitions against male/female job-related stereotyping, sexual harassment, unequal opportunities for training, advancement and other benefits of employment.

TITLE IX AND 4-H QUOTAS

Given that the use of quotas to assure representation of boys and girls on a team are NOT in compliance with Title IX, what are some strategies for assuring that boys and girls have equal opportunity to play in sports?

For contact sports, separate teams of boys and girls are allowed. For non-contact sports, adult managers/coaches should *emphasize the educational value of the 4-H program (versus solely focusing upon the win/loss record)*. They must examine every step in the process to remove barriers facing girls that the boys would not have to overcome. For example, when boys and girls are playing on the same team, rules or policies requiring equal playing time may be a strategy. Different standards, criteria, or rules for boys and girls are NOT the answer.

BE SURE YOUR TEAM HAS ALLOWED ALL GIRLS AND BOYS, WHO WANTED TO PLAY KICKBALL, TO DO SO.

Each Club President, Club Advisor, or adult coach will sign off that their club has NOT disallowed or kept a girl or boy who wanted to play, from the chance to play.


