2018 - 2019 4-H ENROLLMENT

It is enrollment time! All enrollments and re-enrollments for leaders and members will be done using 4HOline and must be completed each year, even if you will be staying in the same projects.

Current Members: Re-enrollment will go through Thursday, November 1st. When you log in to re-enroll, please update your contact information if anything has changed, review and confirm the waivers and agreements and most importantly, update the health information tab. The health form is required of all youth for any overnight and or camp style events. To make the best of your time and the office personnel's time, please update this form with current information and date it at the bottom with the current date at the time of enrollment. **Please note: you must be re-enrolled by November 1st, but may be approved in 4-HOnline at a later date.**

Clubs and projects will remain in your profile. It is important to delete ones you no longer want and to add new ones. Once you have completely updated your family member's individual profiles, click submit after each one. If you need assistance with enrollment please contact our office during business hours. Please note 4-HOnline works best with Google Chrome and FireFox internet search engines. Internet Explorer is not compatible and will kick you out or not allow your password.

It is imperative that members enroll or re-enroll on time by November 1st. These deadlines are set by the state office for grant reporting information. Please make sure to give yourself enough time to complete your enrollment so we can have a great 2018-19 4-H Year!

New Members: to enroll in 4-H for the first time, please go to www.4HOnline.com and create a family profile. It is suggested that you also visit or contact the UW-Extension Office to learn more about 4-H, go to www.chippewa.uwex.edu or join us for our 4-H Informational Open House on Monday, October 1st at 6:00 p.m. in Room 3 of the Chippewa County Courthouse.

Enrollment Deadlines:

November 1 - deadline for 4-H re-enrollments. Youth who have been absent/inactive for more than 12 months are considered a new member upon joining 4-H again.

February 1 - deadline for youth to enroll into 4-H to be eligible to exhibit at the Northern Wisconsin State Fair - Junior Fair.

March 1 - deadline for 4-H members to add or drop projects.

After March 1 - youth may still join 4-H, but will only be able to participate in 4-H activities as a member.

"Achievement and Member in Good Standing"

The Chippewa County 4-H Leaders Council requires 4-H members who participate in county-wide educational programs to meet Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria. These educational programs include, but are not limited to, the 4-H/FFA Quality Meat Animal Program, Chippewa County 4-H Horse Program, 4-H Shooting Sports

Program, 4-H Dog Program, etc. To Achieve and be a Member in Good Standing, a member must:

- Give a demonstration or talk
- Exhibit a project at club meeting, club tour, public exhibit, community or county fair
- Complete your record book by August 31 or date set by club leadership
- Attend monthly club meetings regularly and participate in club activities (4-H Club may designate a percentage rule
- Re-enroll through 4-H Online by November 1

If planning to participate in county-wide educational programs during the 2019-2020 4-H year, 4-H members should plan to meet Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria for the 2018-2019 4-H Year. Members not meeting Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria will be ineligible to enroll in county-wide educational programs, apply for trips, scholarships, etc.

4-H Annual Charter Renewal

All clubs and committees must complete the Wisconsin 4-H Annual Charter renewal forms and submit them to the Extension Office no later than October 15, 2018. You must submit the required information with the form:

- June 2018 bank Statement
- Bylaws for your club/organization, if any changes since the 2017 Charter submission

Non-compliance will result in notice to your club or committee of suspension until further notice.

Mandated Reporter Training

All volunteers are now required to complete an online training as part of their volunteer screening process. This is in addition the face-to-face training that new volunteers are required to attend. This portion of the training is done through 4-H Online and will take approximately 1 1/2 hours to complete and includes a brief quiz. Instruction on how to complete this online training are included in this newsletter.

Background Checks

All new volunteers and returning volunteers falling on their 4-year rotation for a background check will be required to pass the National Background check prior to their acceptance as a 4-H volunteer. Background checks are conducted by the state 4-H office and will be done every 2 (two) weeks. Volunteers will receive an email from GIS requesting the necessary information to complete the check and has a response deadline of 5 days. After the 5 day deadline the link is no longer valid and you will go into the second attempt group approximately 2-4 weeks later. If you fail to complete the information on the second attempt it will be assumed you are no longer interested in being a volunteer. Please be sure to look for this email from GIS about two weeks after you enroll. Check your spam mail as well.

4-H Code of Conduct

The Wisconsin 4-H Code of conduct is updated for the 2018-2019 4-H year. 4-H youth and volunteers sign this in 4-H Online when enrolling/reenrolling in 4-H.

As a 4-H participant, I will:

- Be curious to learn
- Be respectful to self and others
- Work to positively resolve problems or differences
- Accept guidance from Extension volunteers and staff
- Follow program rules, curfews, dress codes, policies, and rules of the facility being used.
- Use appropriate language, exhibit good sportsmanship, and be a positive role model.
- Comply with local, state and federal laws.
- Abstain from use of alcohol, illicit drugs, and tobacco during 4-H events and activities.
- Fully participate in scheduled activities and orientations
- Respect others' property and privacy rights.

- Abstain from child abuse (physical, sexual, emotional and neglect), harassment, hazing and bullying.
- Refrain from all sexual activity/contact
- Accept personal responsibility for behavior including any financial damage.
- Follow safety rules.

Consequences for violating any part of this Code of Conduct may include, but are not limited to:

- Removal from leadership positions held.
- Removal from participation in the event in which the Code of Conduct has been violated
- (at the individual's expense).
- Forfeiture or repayment of financial support for the event.
- Sanctions on participation in future 4-H events.
- Suspension of membership.
- Dismissal from 4-H.

Cost:

\$85 registration fee per person - Friday – Sunday (pizza buffet, 3 meals Saturday, 1 meal Sunday)

\$75 registration fee per person - Saturday – Sunday (3 meals Saturday, 1 meal Sunday)

\$70 registration fee - Saturday – (lunch and Hall of Fame dinner) & \$50 registration fee - Saturday – (lunch only) Lodging:

Adults

\$50/night if there are two adults

\$80/night for single adult room (limited availability)

\$25/night with three or more adults per room

Youth

\$25/night with three to six youth per room

The program kicks off Friday evening with over 15 interactive sessions. Saturday offers more than 25 workshops to choose from. Top off the night with a special celebration where 9 laureates will be inducted in to the Wisconsin 4-H Hall of Fame. An evening of circle dancing and table games will follow the celebration. Sunday morning brings a high energy program that you can use at the club or community level.

All youth participants need to have a chaperone who has completed Youth Protection identified when they register. Ask your county Extension Staff about registering today. Register through 4HOnline beginning September 5. Registration will end September 26.

Opportunities

Awards Application packets will be sent via email by Sept. 17 to all youth eligible for Awards Trips in 2018-2019. Experiences are briefly highlighted below. The process will be similar to 2017-2018.

The purpose of Wisconsin 4-H Educational Programs is to: provide opportunities for young people to develop life skills in new and diverse settings across the state and nation, encourage youth leaders to learn about and appreciate different ideas and perspectives while forming lasting relationships, prepare young people for future opportunities and experiences that require independence, decision making and problem solving, and inspire action in youth and adult volunteers in their clubs, their communities and their schools.

Awards Trip Application packets are due **November 1st** to the Chippewa County Extension Office. Please note: Camp Counselor Applications (both overnight and day camp) will be due **February 1** to the Chippewa County Extension Office.

American Spirit East—June 7-16 or July 5-14, 2019

Approximately 40 youth learn about America's heritage and build awareness of the many steps taking to gain U.S. independence and freedom by visiting historical sites in Philadelphia, New York, Boston and more. Delegates must be in 8th-10th grade at the time of selection. Approximate fee: \$1400

Citizenship Washington Focus-June 15-23 or July 6-14

Approximately 120 Wisconsin youth are selected to attend this leadership program held at the National 4-H Center in Washington D.C. Participants learn the importance of civic and social responsibilities as they relate to the development of better citizens and leaders. The week consists of participatory workshops, speakers, committee work, field trips and social events. Delegates must be in 10th-12th grade at the time of selection and minimum age is 15 by the time of the program. Delegates may only attend once as a youth. Approximate fee of \$1400.

Wisconsin 4-H & Youth Conference-June 24-27

Approximately 500 youth attend this pre-college program in Madison, WI each summer. Participants take part in educational seminars and assemblies and meet people from across Wisconsin. They are encouraged to take what they learn and share it with others in their home community. Delegates must be in 7th-10th grade at the time of selection. Members of Wisconsin Leadership Council, State Art Team, State Communications Team and Drama Company may be in 9th-13th grades.

Space Camp—April 25-29

Delegates team up for hands-on mock space missions and other STEM activities in this NASA program while exchanging ideas with 4-H youth from across Wisconsin. Delegates must be in 6th-8th grade at the time of the program. Maximum age is 15 at the time of the program. Camp counselors may be in 7th to 10th grade. Delegates may only attend once as a youth (excludes counselors). Approximate fee of \$625.

National 4-H Conference—April 5-11

Six to eight youth are selected to attend this working civic conference held at the National 4-H Center in Washington, D.C. Each delegate selects an issue and collaborates with youth from across the country in an effort to help better direct future 4-H programming. Delegates spend the majority of time contributing to stimulating, task-oriented groups. One day is spent on Capitol Hill meeting with Wisconsin legislators. Delegates must be in 10th-12th grade during the program. The maximum age to participate is 18 as of 1/1/19. Approximate fee is \$1300.

National 4-H Congress—Nov 29-Dec 3, 2019

Held in Atlanta, GA Delegates participate in self-development seminars, tours and perform community service while exchanging ideas with youth from across the country. Delegates must be in 10th-12th grade at the time of selection. The maximum age to participate is 18 as of 1/1/19. Approximate fee is \$1200.

Chippewa Co. 4-H Leaders will fund up to 50% of an experience if all criteria are met. See awards packet for details

Cloverbud Corner

APPLE STAMP COASTERS

To make this craft, you will need:

Cork coasters

Red Acrylic Paint

Paint Brush

1 Small Apple

Knife

String or Ribbon

Scissors

Steps:

After gathering supplies, use the knife to cut the apple in half. Cutting the apple through the center will reveal the star inside.

Paint one half of the apple red.

Press painted apple onto a cork coaster.

Pull the apple up firmly to reveal the print. Repeat with the rest of the coasters.



When the coasters are dry, stack them together and tie with a piece of twine or ribbon. You can use these as a fair project, give them as a gift or use them at home!

4-H Family Event

On Saturday, October 20th, Chippewa County 4-H will be sponsoring a family event to Govin's Corn Maze. We will be meeting at the Chippewa County Courthouse at 3:30 p.m. to carpool to the Corn Maze. This year's maze theme is "Packers 100 Seasons." We will be staying past dusk to enjoy the maze using our flashlights, so please bring one with if you have one!

Youth in grades 6 and up can attend by themselves (limited car space available), and youth in grades K-5 are welcome to attend with a parent. Please note: if you plan on driving youth, you must be an active 4-H volunteer.

The cost is \$9.50 for youth/adults age 5 and up. If a family member from ages 2-4 would like to attend, it is \$4.25 and under 2 are free! Registration forms are due to the Chippewa UWEX Office by Friday, October 12th.
