Member Spotlight Story

Kalli Fliehr, a 2018 Chippewa County 4-H Graduate, is a Wisconsin 4-H Key Award winner along this year's Spirit of Paul Roth Camp Counselor Memorial Award. Kalli first joined 4-H as a Cloverbud in the Wissota Raptors 4-H club. As a twelve year member, Kalli served in multiple officer roles, including Sunshine leader, President, and Secretary and started taking projects to the Northern Wisconsin State Fair in the areas of Horse, photography, youth leadership, arts and crafts, and woodworking. Several of these have been selected to the State Fair, where she has also exhibited. She also was an active participant of the Chippewa County 4-H Shooting Sports program along with 4-H experiences, such as State Conference and 4-H Camp.

She cites horse as her favorite project area. She says "it enabled me to make lifelong friends and create many unforgettable moments in my 4-H career." This leads her to her currently as she is a sophomore attending UW-River Falls with a pre-veterinary medicine major. Outside of classes, Kalli participates in the UWRF Rodeo Club (no doubt using her 4-H gymkhana experiences!), the UWRF Equestrian Club, the UWRF CARE Club (Companion Animal Care Club) and the UWRF Optimist Club. Throughout her high school years, she also participated in the Chippewa Falls High School Equestrian Team, Track and Cross Country. She continues to give back to her community by helping at Agnes' Table, Adopt A Highway and Come Now & Eat.

4-H Camp has been a mainstay in Kalli's summer since she was in 4th grade. Kalli loved camp, because it allowed her to realize that even though there are rules at camp, it is still FUN. As a camper, one of her goals was to become a Camp Counselor. In 2015, Kalli had that chance to apply and interview, and then was selected to be a camp counselor. Through attending two overnight counselor trainings and a few meetings, she helped pick a camp theme, created a session that she planned and taught to campers, and built lifelong relationships with youth from around Chippewa County.

She states "Over the many years I was able to attend camp both as a camper and counselor I have always wanted to create lifetime memories with the kids that attend. Camp has made me a stronger leader and has taught me how to have fun yet follow the rules at the same time. Becoming a camp counselor was one of my biggest goals as a camper and I really looked up to my counselors and wanted to be just like them so that's what I did. I want to be that role model that the kids look up to and want to be like someday."

The Overnight Camp Committee this year awarded Kalli the Paul Roth Camp Counselor Memorial Award as the committee saw Kalli as a true leader at camp. Heidi Frisinger stated in our selection process, "You can see the growth in Kalli from her first year as a counselor to now. She came up with creative songs, a very creative session and has built a positive relationship with the campers she has worked with throughout the years." Upon receiving the award, it meant something to Kalli !

Congrats Kalli! We are so proud of you for both of these accomplishments and look forward to seeing you succeed in college and adulthood.

The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. Selection in based on a youth's leadership skills, community service, projects, and personal development throughout their 4-H career. Applicants must be in 9th grade and apply according to their county's Awards policies.

The Spirit of Paul Roth Camp Counselor Memorial Award is given out each year since 2002 at Chippewa County's 4-H Camp. Camp was the best part of Paul's summer each year and when he became a counselor, he made sure every camper had fun at camp. He poured his heart and soul into being a counselor. In remembrance of him, the Overnight Camp Committee selects a recipient each year who embodies the meaning of camp and youth leadership within a counselor setting.

"Achievement and Member in Good Standing"

The Chippewa County 4-H Leaders Council requires 4-H members who participate in county-wide educational programs to meet Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria. These educational programs include, but are not limited to, the 4-H/FFA Quality Meat Animal Program, Chippewa County 4-H Horse Program, 4-H Shooting Sports

Program, 4-H Dog Program, etc. To Achieve and be a Member in Good Standing, a member must:

- Give a demonstration or talk
- Exhibit a project at club meeting, club tour, public exhibit, community or county fair
- Complete your record book by August 31 or date set by club leadership
- Attend monthly club meetings regularly and participate in club activities (4-H Club may designate a percentage rule
- Re-enroll through 4-H Online by November 1

If planning to participate in county-wide educational programs during the 2018-2019 4-H year, 4-H members should plan to meet Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria for the 2017-2018 4-H Year. Members not meeting Achievement and Member in Good Standing criteria will be ineligible to enroll in county-wide educational programs, apply for trips, scholarships, etc.

If you have questions about meeting these requirements, contact your local 4-H Club Leader and/or Program Chair.

DIY SUCCULENT TERRARIUM

Makes: 1 terrarium

- Vermiculite or sand
- Cactus potting soil mix
- Assorted succulents
- Rocks or pebbles (optional)
- Preserved moss (optional)

1. Create a base layer of vermiculite to help with water drainage.

2. Add a layer of cactus potting soil.

3. Carefully place succulents and secure with soil.

4. Finish with stones and moss, if desired.
