Dear Family and Friends of Chippewa County 4-H,

The name of the game in 4-H for the next few months is Communication and the Arts. As leaders, members, parents and even staff . . . we all have responsibilities to communicate in one way or another. And, when we are communicating, there are three very important elements of communication that make it truly effective.

The first of these involves our HEAD; you have to know about something in order to talk about it. Don't get me wrong, I am familiar with plenty of people who know very little about any given topic and still choose to discuss it at length. But in a world where credibility can take one a long way, genuine knowledge or experience is vital.

Secondly, you have to have HEART. Emotional investment, or what some call passion, only makes a speaker more credible and helps the listener engage in the words coming out of one's mouth. People who really care about what it is they are talking about are simply better communicators than those who feel lukewarm about everything. In my opinion, this element gets to the heart of why leaders in the 4-H Program are the best.

In addition, we should always ask ourselves if our communication is HEALTHY.

Are we communicating in a way that is emotionally safe for others? Are we choosing the right words, time, place and audience to deliver our message to? It only does more harm than good when any of these safety elements is misused.

Finally, an effective communicator will use their HANDS (and their feet, and body, and their faces) to communicate a message that goes beyond words. Some call this walking the talk. They will not only teach and lead others by their words but by their actions. As you prepare for upcoming 4-H communication arts opportunities, whether it's a speech or demonstration or leading a club or project meeting, remember these three elements and ask yourself; am I using the four H's of effective communication? If not, where can I make the best better?

A friendly reminder that downhill skiing, snowboarding, sledding and other downhill winter sports are excluded (not covered) by the AIL year round accident policy used by 4-H clubs on a statewide, county wide, and individual club basis.

The good news is coverage is available online at www.americanincomelife.com by choosing the "Submit 4-H Activity Report" button and requesting special activity insurance used for individual group events like ski trips. All three plan options provide full accident coverage for downhill skiing, snowboarding, sledding and other downhill winter sports. As with all your activities be sure to follow all safety measures communicated by your state as well as rules and regulations posted at the facility being used.

Teams receive points for correct answers and may lose points for incorrect answers. The team with the highest final score is the winner. Youth in Air Pistol MUST be in 3rd grade, 8 years old and achieved in the 4-H program in 2017-2018 if it is their second year or more in the 4-H program. Youth in .22 Pistol must be 12 years old AND completed Hunter Safety and/or one year air pistol. Youth 14 years old and older may take the .22 pistol class; however one year of air pistol is recommended.

Opportunities

Chippewa County 4-H was recently selected as one of Microsoft's Digital Ambassador counties! Microsoft is partnering with National 4-H Council on a new project about digital and broadband internet literacy. This project entitled "4-H Digital Ambassadors" will use teens as teachers to provide training and communication to assist adults in their community with increasing their comfort level in utilizing new technology. The goal is that this work will have profound effects in workforce development and community sustainability by helping adults understand how broadband connectivity can impact their lives for the better. The project also targets youth leadership outcomes and creates an opportunity for youth voice in an important area.

The project will engage four to six youth (in grades 7 and up) and two adult leaders. These individuals will be trained on a specific digital literacy curriculum and be responsible for hosting six to ten learning sessions in their communities by June of 2020. The youth will plan, promote and lead the learning sessions with the assistance of the adult leaders and local Extension staff. Youth do not have to be current 4-H members, but the adults will have to go through a background check.

Chippewa County was eligible for this opportunity based on gaps in broadband access.

What's in it for us?

- Each participating county will receive approximately \$5000 for the project implementation and an additional \$1500 for technology and hotspots.
- Training for the Digital Ambassador Team to gain a broad understanding of digital literacy issues and broadband connectivity.
- An opportunity to reach new audiences of youth and adults.
- The Digital Ambassador Team will gain teaching, planning and leadership experience that will serve them for years to come.

What are the roles/responsibilities of the Digital Ambassador Team?

- Each Team will send two adults and two youth to a two-day face-to-face training in Chicago, IL during March 15 & 16, 2019. Everything for this training is paid directly by Microsoft. Two youth have already committed to the program and will be attending.
- Teams will take photos during planning meetings and learning events to submit quarterly along with a paragraph description.
- Submit a project plan by April 15, 2019.
- Teams will participate in virtual meetings with Microsoft and National 4-H throughout the grant period.

Engineering Design Challenge

County Wide Engineering Challenge! This is a self-guided challenge for 6-12th grade with the competition being held during the 4-H Teens Volleyball Tournament in Cadott on **March 24**, **2019**. There will be 2 separate challenges; bridge building and rat trap powered tractor pulling. The cost is \$10.00 to do one or both, so I encourage you to try both! Be sure to put "4-H challenge" in your subject line. The supplies can be picked up at the UW Extension Office, or by contacting Scott Hansen. Awards will be given for first and second place in each challenge.

Bridge Building Goal: to build a bridge with only a limited amount of supplies, and support weight.

Test: weight will be hung from the center of the bridge, the bridge that holds the most weight before failure wins.

Competitors will be given a set amount of wood strips to build a bridge that will span an 15.5 inch distance and be no longer than 16 inches. The only building material to be used will be the supplied wood strips. The only fastening of strips will be glue of their own choosing.



Tractor Pull Goal: to build a tractor powered by a single rat trap that can pull a weight over a distance.

Test: The distance pulled will be multiplied by the weight pulled. This amount will be the tractor's "rat -power". The tractor with the greatest "rat-power" wins.

Competitors will be using a single Victor rat trap, no other forms of stored energy, such as weights or springs, etc. will be allowed. Design will be open to the competitor, and the only part supplied will be the trap. Each competitor will be allowed three pulls at different weights of their choosing, with the highest rat-powered tractor winning.

Currently no YouTube videos of this, but you can find videos of mouse trap powered cars. The theory will be the same, only there will be weight to be pulled.



Cloverbud Corner

Let's Grow Vegetables!

Let's identify seeds using a handy seed chart.

Materials:

White Paper

Plate

Ruler

Glue

Markers

8 Kinds of Seeds (Example: Bean, Pea, Spinach, Corn, Radish, and Cucumber)

Procedure:

- 1. Divide the paper plate into eighths, like a pie. First divide the plate in half, then in fourths, followed by eighths. Draw lines using a marker and a ruler.
- 2. In each segment, glue a seed, label it, and draw a picture of the vegetable.



It's now time to plant some seeds!



Materials:

Seeds (leftover from the handy seed chart)
Potting Soil
Paper Egg Carton
Water

Procedure:

- 1. Remove the lid from the egg carton and fill each section about ³/₄ full with potting soil.
- 2. Place the seeds in the soil according to the package directions.
- 3. Place the egg carton in a location of natural light and water the seeds regularly.
- 4. Watch your garden grow! As the seedlings get larger, transplant them into your garden or larger pots by cutting the egg carton segment and planting the whole part in the ground.
