Setting goals can help you prioritize your opportunities and help you fulfill the Chippewa County 4-H expectations that every leader contributes to planning and leading at least 1 project meeting or activity. Plan a community service project that offers member hands-on experience with the project. Invite a guest speaker to your 4-H club to talk about a project topic.

4-H Winter Activities and Club Insurance

A friendly reminder that downhill skiing, snowboarding, sledding and other downhill winter sports are excluded (not covered) by the AIL year round accident policy used by 4-H clubs on a statewide, county wide, and individual club basis.

The good news is coverage is available online at www.americanincomelife.com by choosing the "Submit 4-H Activity Report" button and requesting special activity insurance used for individual group events like ski trips. All three plan options provide full accident coverage for downhill skiing, snowboarding, sledding and other downhill winter sports. As with all your activities be sure to follow all safety measures communicated by your state as well as rules and regulations posted at the facility being used.

Leaders may only teach in the discipline in which they are certified. An adult leader cannot provide hands-on or safety instruction without a certified leader supervising the range.

All leaders must first complete one 12-hour workshop to be certified. After that, you may be eligible to attend a Saturday, eight-hour range workshop to receive an additional discipline certification. If three years lapse before adding an additional certification, the full 12-hour certification must be repeated. Only one certification may be obtained at any one certification workshop.

Engineering Design Challenge

County Wide Engineering Challenge! This is a self-guided challenge for 6-13th grade with the competition being held during the 4-H Teens Volleyball Tournament in Cadott on **March 24, 2019**. There will be 2 separate challenges; bridge building and rat trap powered tractor pulling. The cost is \$10.00 to do one or both, so I encourage you to try both! For more information, a complete set of rules, or if you like me to come to your 4-H meeting contact: Scott Hansen at 715-568-4260 or email Scott Hansen at pizzacutter4x4@hotmail.com. Be sure to put "4-H challenge" in your subject line. The supplies can be picked up at the UW Extension Office, or by contacting Scott Hansen. Awards will be given for first and second place in each challenge.

Bridge Building Goal: to build a bridge with only a limited amount of supplies, and support weight.

Test: weight will be hung from the center of the bridge, the bridge that holds the most weight before failure wins.

Competitors will be given a set amount of wood strips to build a bridge that will span an 15.5 inch distance and be no longer than 16 inches. The only building material to be used will be the supplied wood strips. The only fastening of strips will be glue of their own choosing.

Visit YouTube and search for "Science Olympiad Bridge Building" to see videos of bridges being put to the test!

Tractor Pull Goal: to build a tractor powered by a single rat trap that can pull a weight over a distance.

Test: The distance pulled will be multiplied by the weight pulled. This amount will be the tractor's "ratpower". The tractor with the greatest "rat-power" wins.

Competitors will be using a single Victor rat trap, no other forms of stored energy, such as weights or springs, etc. will be allowed. Design will be open to the competitor, and the only part supplied will be the trap. Each competitor will be allowed three pulls at different weights of their choosing, with the highest rat-powered tractor winning.

Currently no YouTube videos of this, but you can find videos of mouse trap powered cars. The theory will be the same, only there will be weight to be pulled.

Cloverbud Corner

Super Easy One Seam Fleece Hat

What you will need:

You will need ½ yard fleece – this should make 2 hats Scissors
Sewing machine



Steps:

- 1. Cut a rectangular piece of the fleece 16 inches wide by 21 inches long cut it so it stretches the long way. This will be the way it goes around your head. You may end up having to make more or less than 21 inches depending on head size.
- 2. Fold the piece in half with the wrong sides together.
- 3. Stitch the sides (the shorter sides approximately 16 inches) together starting about 3 ½ inches from the top edge and stopping about 2 ½ inches from the bottom. Both the top and the bottom will look unfinished at this point (this is because of the fringe and the bottom band).
- 4. Turn the hat (tube) right side out. Finish the seam on one end of the hat this will be the bottom and will have a more finished look when you turn the band up.
- 5. Make the fringe on the other end that is not sewn all the way take scissors and cut strips down into the fabric to make the fringe SEE PHOTO. You can make the fringe however wide you want it I usually do about ½ ½ inches. Do this all along the top edge.
- 6. Cut a strip of fabric from the scraps about 4-5 inches long and ¼ inch wide. Gather the fringe end of the hat and tie it tightly where the fringe meets the hat.
- 7. Turn up the bottom band and YOU HAVE A WARM HAT!
