Fall Forums is coming! Held November 1-3, 2019 at the Green Lake Conference Center, youth and adults have the opportunity to engage in statewide training with 4-H staff, volunteers and other youth. Online registration is now open for adults planning to complete a shooting sports certification in archery, coordinator, muzzle loader, shotgun, rifle/air rifle and pistol/air pistol. This training will be held September 13-14 at the Central WI Sportmen's Club in Marshfield.

Adults age 21 and over must successfully complete a certification workshop in their discipline of choice and complete their county 4-H leader training before supervising shooting activities. Shooting activities can only be supervised by a 4-H Shooting Sports leader who holds a certification in the discipline they are supervising.
