YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care for Animals) will be again required for specific animal exhibitors at the Northern Wisconsin State Fair in the following species: Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goat, Rabbit and Poultry. Youth must take this course yearly and provide documentation to the fair. The first face-to-face session will be offered by Jerry Clark on Monday, March 30 at 6:15 PM at the Eagleton Town Hall. Youth must be pre-registered for the program at https://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login and there are limited seats. One more face-to-face option will be available in May or youth can opt to take it online. Youth over 18 can only take the online option.





The 9-12 Grade U.S. Adventure Experience registration is now open! Youth in grades 9-12 will be venturing to Missouri this year. Stops include: Mark Twain's hometown, St. Louis Arch, the City Museum, Grant Farms, the St. Louis Zoo and MORE!
