Join us on Saturday, April 4, 2020 at the Howard Town Hall for a 4-H Rabbit Project Learning Clinic. Shelly, the Chippewa County rabbit project leader, will help youth learn how to pick out a rabbit, answer showmanship questions, grooming and care, feeding, diseases and first aid, different breeds, and much more. Cost of the clinic is \$5.00 per youth which will include the lunch and materials. RSVP's are requested and fees are due by March 27, 2020 to the Chippewa County Extension Office. The 5-8 Grade WI Adventure Experience registration is now open! Youth will be venturing to Green Bay, WI from June 16-18. Stops include: The Menominee Nation Museum, Lambeau Field, Bay Beach Nature Preserve and Amusement Park, and touring and eating at a pizza farm on the way home. Youth will build their understanding of Wisconsin culture and history on this experience. The cost of \$175 includes all lodging, meals, admission and transportation. YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care for Animals) will be again required for specific animal exhibitors at the Northern Wisconsin State Fair in the following species: Dairy, Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goat, Rabbit and Poultry. Youth must take this course yearly and provide documentation to the fair. The first face-to-face session will be offered by Jerry Clark on Monday, March 30 at 6:15 PM at the Eagleton Town Hall. One more face-to-face option will be available in May or youth can opt to take it online. Youth over 18 can only take the online option.
