Welcome to your weekly addition of the Chippewa Chatter! We are looking forward to sharing with you the latest and greatest in the 4-H world in weekly updates.

As of June 8th, Wisconsin 4-H is allowing virtual and no-contact 4-H programming. "No-contact" programs are defined as programs that: cannot be conducted virtually, are held outdoors, have only one youth or household engaged at a time (Note: household members may help ensure a child is never alone with an adult), are staggered so there is no contact, if more than one youth/household is engaged, and any shared equipment is sanitized between uses. This could include things such as staggered horse individual instruction, dog obedience etc., supply sharing through curbside pick up or delivery and managerial 4-H projects.

By July 1, Wisconsin 4-H hopes to allow small gatherings of up to 10 individuals, with safety precautions. More information to follow regarding safety considerations for gatherings. Groups of 50 or more will not be allowed for considerable time - so please start making plans into fall how to accommodate club functions, events or meetings.
